Parenting a difficult child can be painful and burdensome to most adults. It challenges the parent to deal with intense loss, disappointment, helplessness, anger and compromise at various developmental stages. This presentation will discuss the interlinked effects on therapists' personal and professional lives when they find themselves to be parents of troubled children, and will describe some of the paradoxes inherent in maintaining these dual roles.
